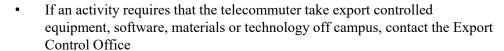
## **EXPORT CONTROL GUIDELINES FOR TELECOMMUTING**

## What is Telecommuting?

- Telecommuting is when staff members are conducting their work activities away from their normal work location
  - o This does not include persons assigned to a non-campus location to fulfill their work responsibilities such as:
    - o Physicians or nurses working at a non-campus clinic
    - Persons conducting climate studies in Antarctica
  - o Examples of staff telecommuting are:
    - o Persons working from home during the pandemic
    - Persons working from a foreign country because travel to the U.S. has been interrupted
- Students taking classes from locations away from their normal classroom or lab setting are telecommuting
  - Examples of students telecommuting are:
    - o Students taking on-line classes from their apartment on campus during the pandemic
    - Students taking cataloged courses internationally while visiting family outside of the U.S.

## <u>Telecommuting from U.S.</u>

- Typically, activities that are normally conducted on campus, but are now being conducted elsewhere in the U.S. are not an export concern
- Potential concerns:



- Access to sensitive data (such as HIPAA, FERPA and export controlled information) shall be done through VPN
- Export controlled information shall not be shared with foreign persons



- Contact the Export Control Office if staff or students plan to telecommute internationally to determine if an export license is required.
- Transfer of equipment, software, materials or technology internationally may require an export license
  - Any project information should be accessed through VPN
  - Special safeguards may need to be established to protect sensitive data internationally
- An export license will be required for a student taking on-line courses from Cuba (graduate courses), Iran, North Korea, Syria and Crimea
- Export controls for telecommuters applies to everyone including U.S. and foreign nationals, regardless of visa status or previous time in the U.S.
