At least 10 years experience in marine sciences or related research with significant experience in research management and demonstrated ability for scientific leadership. Must be a tenured or tenured-track faculty, or an individual who could be qualified as tenurable. Familiarity with the National Sea Grant College Program and/or the National Institutes for Water Resources is desirable but not required.

Job Summary:

The University of Wisconsin Aquatic Sciences Center (ASC) is a UW-Madison program of multidisciplinary research, education and outreach dedicated to the protection and sustainable use of Wisconsin's water resources - our lakes, rivers, and groundwater - as well as Wisconsin waters of Lakes Michigan and Superior. Together with other funding activities compatible with the ASC mission, the Center administers two major multidisciplinary, system-wide research programs - the Sea Grant Institute (SGI), focusing on the protection and sustainable use of the nation's Great Lakes, and the Water Resources Institute (WRI), focusing on solutions to Wisconsin's present and emerging water resources issues. Both SGI and WRI function as grant agencies on behalf of NOAA and USGS, awarding over \$5M in funding annually to Wisconsin public and private universities and colleges. In addition, ASC is also the administrative home of WATER@UW, a large umbrella organization of over 170 water researchers and scholars at UW-Madison. Visit www.aqua.wisc.edu for more information.

The mission of ASC is directly related to the newly announced RISE-EARTH initiative, specifically reimagining economic and environmental systems centering around water sustainability.

The Director initiates, establishes, develops and manages collaborative relationships with the University's scientific community, state and federal agencies and other private and public sectors.
