## Foreign Talent Recruitment Programs (FTRP)

An effort organized or funded by a foreign government or entity to recruit professionals or students regardless of citizenship or national origin.

- •Many countries sponsor talent programs for purposes of attracting researchers in targeted fields.
- •Can be legitimate means of attracting talent, and can include offers for research fellowships and grants to incentivize researchers to relocate.
- •Note: involvement with a talent program may be permitted, but must be disclosed.



#### **U.S. Government Concerns**

- Participation in some foreign talent recruitment programs sponsored by specific government entities could lead to:
  - Undisclosed conflicts of interest or commitment,
  - Inappropriate transfer of federally-funded research to foreign governments,
  - Violation of export control laws, or
  - Theft of intellectual property.
- \*These may signal participation in a Malign Foreign Talent Recruitment Program.



#### What Makes a Program Malign?

Designed to recruit individuals with access to sensitive research, intellectual property, proprietary data, or otherwise non-public information. Can include:

- Unauthorized transfer of materials or information;
- Establishing a laboratory or entity in a foreign country;
- Accepting a faculty position, or other employment;
- Work that overlaps or duplicates a federal research award;
- And more...



### What Makes a Program Malign?, cont.

A program that is sponsored by an entity based in a foreign country of concern:

- The People's Republic of China (including Hong Kong and Macau),
- North Korea,
- Russia,
- Iran, or
- Any other country determined to be a country of concern by the Secretary of State, or



### Recognizing a Malign Foreign Talent Recruitment Program

- Research funding/facilities
- Honorific titles or appointments
- Contracts that are difficult to terminate
- Complimentary travel
- Requirement for secret employment contracts
- Requirement to publish based on US funded work
- Mandated attribution requirements



### Why This Is Important To The Federal Government

- Disruption of the peer review process and inappropriate sharing of grant applications.
- Conducting the same or similar research at two different institutions.
- Incomplete disclosures of relationships with foreign governments.
- Activities that gave rise to overall conflicts of interest or commitment.



### **Potential Consequences: Why You Should Care**

Participation in a talent program can have an impact on federal sponsored research opportunities, depending on agency rules and policies.

- Undisclosed participation could affect your federal funding.
- Undisclosed participation could lead to repayment of federal funds.
- Undisclosed participation could lead to legal action.

#### Researcher Responsibilities

#### Disclosure and transparency are paramount.

- •UW–Madison requires submission of disclosures through the <u>Outside</u> Activities Report Dashboard.
- •Federal disclosure requirements are captured through submission of common forms, which include the biographical sketch, current and pending (other) support, and regular project reports.
- •Some federal partners are requiring disclosure as a certification at the proposal stage.
- •Digital Persistent Identifiers (DPI) will also serve as a method of disclosure. ORCID is recommended. (<u>UW-Madison Libraries</u> have resources.)
